Somebody asked me, "Why do calamities happen, Father?" There is no simple answer to that question. But, for the sake of brevity, I can say that calamities may be caused by moral evil committed by man. As man abuses nature, he is surely doomed to suffer consequences. For example, if he cuts all the trees in the forest because of greed, nature can strike back by way of floods that will destroy his life and property. Earthquakes and volcanic eruptions, on the other hand, can hardly be attributed to evil done by man. They are what we call as physical evil. They happen because the world we live in is imperfect. As scripture portrays it, "For we know that up to the present time all of creation groans with pain, like the pain of childbirth" (Rom 8:22). Earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and the like are labor pains before a perfect world can be born. But, why did God not create a perfect world where these calamities don't happen? Well, it's a mystery. We trust in the wisdom of God. The Catechism teaches, "With infinite power God could create something better. But with infinite wisdom and goodness God freely willed to create a world in a state of journeying toward its ultimate perfection... In time we can discover that God in his almighty providence can bring a good from the consequences of an evil... 'We know that in everything God works for good for those who love him' (Rom 8:28)" (CCC, 310-313).....

World Day for Consecrated Life 2020 – February 2, 2020

Please join us for the annual prayer service for World Day for Consecrated Life, which will be held on Sunday February 2nd at 3 PM at Saint Boniface Cathedral. The service will take the form of Taizé prayer. A light reception will follow in the parish hall.

The primary purpose of World Day for Consecrated Life is to pray for women and men religious, and to give thanks for the gift of consecrated life in the church.

This year, we will particularly acknowledge the contribution of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI). The Oblates were the first male religious to arrive at the Red River settlement in 1845, and this year they are marking 175 years of presence here. Over those 175 years, the Oblates have made an immense contribution towards building the church in Saint Boniface and throughout western/northern Canada. In fact, the Oblates were instrumental in establishing the Catholic Church in western Canada.

From the time of Alexandre Taché, one of the first two Oblates to come to the West, (and later second Bishop and first Archbishop of St-Boniface), the Oblates were pioneers and leaders who provided the first bishops for most of the dioceses of western Canada
