PARISH UPDATE 11/14/2021

Today is the Solemnity of Christ, King of the Universe. At catholicculture.org we read of the qualities of Christ's kingdom as described in today's Mass. This kingdom is: (1) supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings; (2) universal, extending to all nations and to all places; (3) eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever"; (4) spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world.".....

Next Sunday is the 1st Sunday of Advent. It is the beginning of a new liturgical year, a new year for the Church so to speak. We may call this day as Resolve Sunday for in the opening prayer of the Mass (Collect), we ask God the “resolve to run forth to meet Christ with righteous deeds at his coming”. We are not just marking a start of a year, therefore, but above all the beginning of a renewed commitment to the faith as disciples of Christ..... During Advent we celebrate with joyful anticipation the feast of the Word becoming flesh in the womb of the Blessed Mother. However, such celebration is not just mere remembering. Above all, it is making the event incarnate in each of our lives. By prayer, penance and good works, we must make room in our lives so that we will be “pregnant” with the light of Christ and give birth to him in a darkened world that desperately needs Him..... The Advent vigilant waiting we are called to do is more challenging than ever because of the restrictions. Not all of us can go to church, so mostly we must accept the challenge on our own. But, you see, from a certain perspective this is a good opportunity to internalize by ourselves our Christian discipleship without the usual support we are used to..... Some of you are suggesting if we can check vaccination status in the church so that we can accommodate more people in the church. No, we cannot make such division in our Christian community. I am convinced Christ do not want that. So too does His Grace, our Archbishop. I encourage you to watch and reflect his recent video posted on the archdiocesan website titled “Covid-Related Measures & Seeing Christ in All”. “The keyword is: loving arrangement, with emphasis on the word ‘loving’.”
