PARISH UPDATE 11/28/2021 –

I thank the Couples for Christ (CFC) for facilitating in the use of the parish hall so that more people can be accommodated during the Sunday morning Mass. Our special gratitude to Jason Lopez for lending us his gadgets and technical know-how so that the Mass may be streamed live to the hall..... Thanks also to Paolo and Juan Gaviria for assisting me during the Christ the King procession. Even with the very short notice and little practice, they did a good job..... It feels it was not so long ago that Pope Francis inaugurated the Year of St. Joseph, but on December 8, we are already going to conclude it. We recall that since this holy year began, we have been reciting the prayer to St. Joseph towards the end of the Mass. I am strongly convinced that the pillar of families has been protecting our bigger family that is our parish especially during this time of pandemic..... It is really providential that Pope Francis has declared the Year of St. Joseph. We thank the Holy Father for it. In preparation for the closing of the year, he is also starting a weekly catechesis on St. Joseph. Last Wednesday he called our attention to the fact that St. Joseph represents a central point in God's plan of salvation, even though he appears discreet and apparently on the margins of the story and of society. "Joseph lives his agency without ever seeking to take over the scene," the pope said. Everyone, he added, can find in St. Joseph—who often goes unnoticed or hidden—an intercessor and a guide in difficult moments..... To end the Year of St. Joseph here in our parish, we will start a novena which will culminate with a consecration to the foster father of the Lord..... The novena will begin on Monday. Since we don't have a public celebration of the Mass on Mondays, I will be praying the novena in behalf of the community. Otherwise, the daily participants of the Mass will do it for all of us.

The Advent season

is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36).

Like Lent, the liturgical colour for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.
