#### **PARISH UPDATE 10/09/2022 –**

Happy Thanksgiving to everyone! During the Mass on Thanksgiving we pray: May God, whose gift are countless and whose goodness is without limit, teach us to use wisely the rich blessings of land and sea, to be attentive to the needs of others, and to give as freely as we have received, that we may, in the joy of his house, delight one day in eternal rewards.....

Manitoba municipal elections are coming up. Paragraph 2240 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds Catholics of their duty to vote: "Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country (Rom. 13:7) ....The Apostle exhorts us to offer prayers and thanksgiving for kings and all who exercise authority, 'that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life, godly and respectful in every way' (1 Tim 2:2).".....If you still remember, the text from 1 Timothy was the second reading at Mass last September 28. In my homily, I said that a quiet and peaceable, godly and respectful life is our goal here on earth as an anticipation of the perfect happiness in heaven. So, we have to pray for those in civil authority to make this feasible.

Persecution, wars and conflicts will make such life impossible..... I would like to add that in electing our officials, we see to it that Christian voice is not cancelled out. So, it is important to have elected personalities who can advance Christ's agenda. For example, we need people in the school board who can call out if textbooks or subjects are being influenced by ideologies contrary to Christian values..... Pray the Rosary! One of the 15 promises revealed by Our Lady to St. Dominic is: Whoever shall recite the rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries, shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
